'Health on the High Street' in Rugby









Strategy for St Cross: 'Elective Hub'

- Following wide consultation, *More than a Hospital* Trust Strategy 2022-2030 committed to transform the Hospital of St Cross in Rugby - build modern facilities for growing population and improve staff and patient experience
- Aligns with 10 Year Plan- moving services closer to communities
- Focus on development of Elective Hub
- Major phase of development: 4 theatre & 2 ward complex planning permission obtained Feb 2025 and advanced design completed
- 'Health on the High Street' planned for some outpatient services to create the required space on the site for new theatre complex but also provides accessible services in fit for purpose facilities

Improving Access for our Patients Now

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- Same day hip and knee replacement surgery (Rugby Ambulatory Orthopaedic Service RAOS)
 commenced January 2024 and has had an evaluation completed with patients.
- Using headsets to improve communication between Theatres and day surgery has led to significant improvements to start times and turnaround times.
- Increased the number of patients on ophthalmology cataracts theatre lists.
- Increased the number of patients receiving Neurosurgery injections theatre session from 10 to 12.
- First Breast Cancer Surgery theatre List delivered this week 8th September using new equipment.

THE NEXT 3 MONTHS


- First keyhole hernia repair and gallbladder removal theatre lists to take place this month.
- Increase access to Ultrasound Fern Suite by extending hours to 6pm on Tuesdays (additional 12 patient per month) initially with a plan to extend to 5 days

Planning workshops with the clinical and operational teams









- Outpatient services that will be delivered in Rugby Town Centre:
 - Diabetes & Endocrinology
 - Women's Health (Obstetrics & Gynaecology including diagnostic procedures)
 - Children's Services
- 14,000 planned patient attendances per year
- Increased footfall in the town

- 4. Space efficient


Reflecting on the restrictions of the current space in a mock up!






Patients and Staff - Initial Designs

Considering movement of patients, access to facilities and staff being able to access equipment easily






